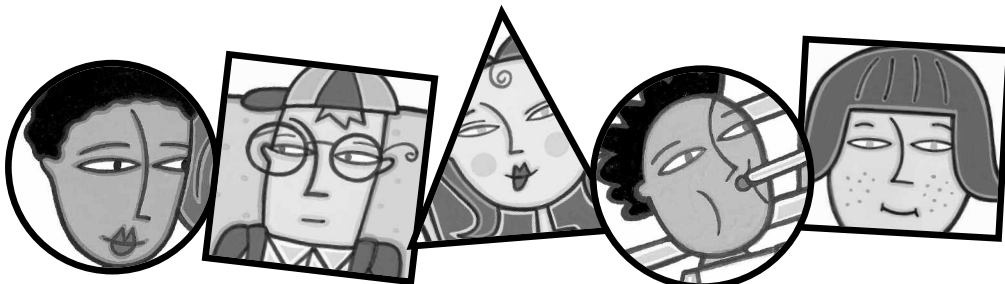

Dear parents:

Summer can be a fun and exciting time for your family. However, finding an affordable summer program that meets your needs can be challenging. Summer is a time for new experiences and helping youth practice skills they learn in school — and having fun. We hope that this directory will help you make plans. It lists a variety of camp, tutorial and other summer programs that are available throughout Hartford and the surrounding area. Programs for youth and adults with disabilities, as well as for senior citizens, are included.

We encourage you to look through the directory and use the information to decide what programs are best for your children, teens, elderly or other family members. If there is a charge for the program, it is noted; however, a number of programs are offered free, or at reduced fees based on income. We recommend registering as early as possible and checking with program staff about whether financial aid is available. Also be aware that a number of the day programs are located in Hartford area schools. Please be sure to check with staff to confirm locations and schedules.

Can my child attend both the Hartford Public Schools Early Start or other HPS morning programs, and a summer camp or other community program?

Yes. The Hartford Public Schools Early Start or other program sessions are held either in the morning or afternoon and a number of the summer camps and other community programs offer half-day sessions. So, if your child is attending Early Start or other HPS programs, he or she can attend a camp or other community program either for a half-day or participate in a full-day program during June or July before summer school is in session. Youth not participating in HPS Summer Programs may enroll in a full-day community program. For details on the Hartford Public Schools Early Start and other programs, please refer to the full description provided in this directory.

What's in each summer program listing?

1. Program location
2. Activities offered
3. Area and ages served
4. Start and end-dates and length of each session

Note: A summer program may be open for six weeks or more, but campers normally attend for

one- or two-week sessions, not all six weeks. Other programs may restrict the number of sessions each participant may attend. Several of the CIT and tutorial programs require youth to participate for a longer period so they can get the full benefit of the program. Contact the program that interests you for more information.

5. **Fees and financial aid:** Some programs have fees. If you are unable to pay the program fee, please contact the program anyway. Many programs offer "camperships," which are similar to scholarships. Your child may qualify for a campership or reduced fee based on family income. Be sure to contact the program that interests you to find out, and note the "◆" and "⊕" symbols used in this directory to indicate when programs offer free or reduced fees for qualified applicants.
6. **Transportation:** Some programs provide transportation. This is noted in the listing.
7. **Registration deadline/program contacts:** The registration deadline and program staff contact information are listed, but don't wait until the deadline to call. Call as soon as possible to help ensure that your child and other family members can participate in the program of their choice.

How to use this directory

This directory lists 56 summer programs. It is divided into three sections: camps, counselor-in-training and tutorial programs.

Camp Programs

These summer programs offer a variety of fun activities including sports, arts, crafts, theater, swimming, computers, science, and other enrichment programs, and much, much more. Both residential and day camps are offered, each providing different types of activities. Pick a program that best suits your child's interests.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Programs

These programs offer older youth who are too young to work a regular job the chance to earn a little money and receive training as assistants at camps or other summer programs. Many of the programs offer a small stipend while helping teens gain important leadership skills. You'll want to sign up quickly for these as CIT internships go fast!

Tutorial Programs

These programs encourage your child's love of learning and academic success — with an emphasis on fun. Each of the programs is different. Review the program descriptions, talk with program staff and select the program that will interest child the most.

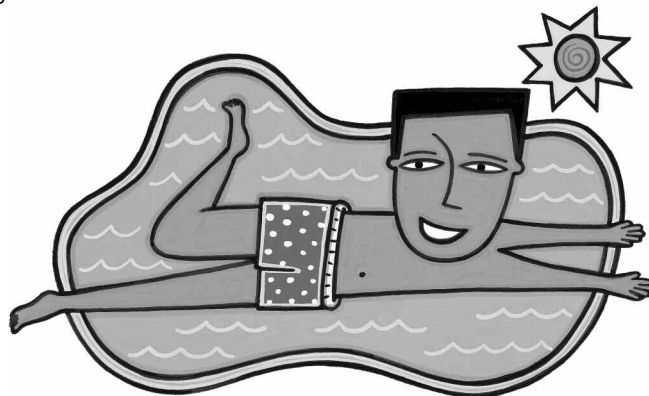
How do I enroll my child in one of these programs?

Contact the program directly. Use the contact information listed in the program listings. If one program is full, call another. There are many options available for children and youth living in the Greater Hartford area.

Are there other summer programs available for children and youth in Greater Hartford?

Yes. For information about summer programs not listed in this directory, dial **2-1-1**. The Agency Phone Index on page 33 can also be helpful in finding additional programs.

2-1-1 can also help families find other services, including free summer food programs for kids, food cooperatives and food pantries, housing information, benefits assistance, health care options, childcare programs, services for children with special needs, and much more. The Hartford Foundation has invested in summer programs since the 1930s. This summer, we are providing nearly \$800,000 in funding to 70 summer programs including camps, tutorial and counselor-in-training programs throughout the region.

We understand that the cost of a summer program can be difficult, especially during these tough economic times. Many of the summer programs listed in this directory offer reduced fees, so we encourage parents to ask about financial assistance.

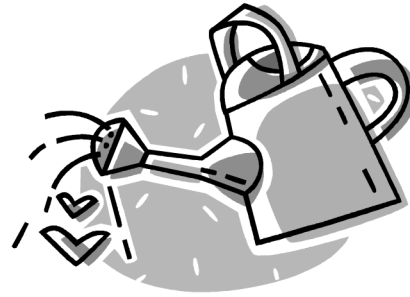

• ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS •

The Hartford Public Schools (HPS) offers a summer program known as **Early Start** for students in Grades K-7, who are mandated to participate according to the details listed below. Current grade 8 students will participate in the Summer Bridge Program. (Please see the following pages for HPS summer programs for high school students.) Early Start students will be taught in the school they attended during the 2010-2011 school year. Students not mandated in Early Start are invited and encouraged to attend **Summer Morning Enrichment** for fun and engaging learning activities and programming. Please find further details below.

For all Early Start students, academics, meals (breakfast and lunch), and nursing services are provided at no cost.

- Early Start Students in grades K-7 will improve in the academic areas of reading and math as evidenced by the results of the pre and post Early Start assessments and participate in enrichment learning opportunities provided by Community Based Organizations (CBOs)
- Summer Morning Enrichment students in Grades K-7 will enjoy programming that will enrich awareness, exposure and skill building in an appropriate theme or concentration

MANDATED PARTICIPANTS FOR EARLY START

Students who **are mandated** to participate in **Early Start** include:

- All students in grades K-3 who score below proficient in reading on the May Developmental Reading Assessment, 2nd edition (DRA2)
- All students in grades 4-7 who score below proficient in reading on the May Degrees of Reading Power (DRP) Assessment
- All K-7 students receiving special education services based on the Planning Placement Team (PPT) decision
- All K-7 students receiving English Language Learner services based on the annual review of program status

Nurses: Each Early Start site will have a nurse on a rotating basis.

Security: Security will be available at each site.

Family Resource Aide or School and Family

Support Service Provider: Serves as the point person for parents for Early Start and provides general assistance

Meals: Breakfast and lunch will be served daily.

HPS Summer Morning Enrichment

K-7 students who are not mandated to attend Early Start are invited and encouraged to participate in the **Morning Enrichment Program**.

Purpose: To provide a summer learning opportunity for non-mandated students that will enrich awareness, exposure and skill building in an appropriate theme or concentration through fun and engaging activities and programming.

How: Highly motivated elementary, middle and high school teachers will design and provide an innovative enrichment experience that builds on skills related to specific themes and interests.

When: The programs will run concurrently with Early Start dates and times.

Where: Located at any elementary, middle or high school with the consent of the principal (TBD). Please contact your school site for confirmation of details.

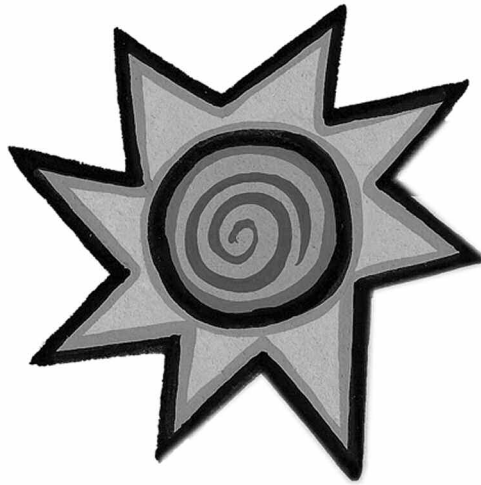
