

Dear Nonprofit Partners,

The Hartford Foundation for Public Giving is pleased to announce that we are accepting applications for grants from the Norma and Natale Sestero Fund. We project that grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$60,000 will be awarded, depending upon the size and maturation of the agency and the scope of work to be performed through the proposed project.

## Purpose of the Fund:

Norma and Natale Sestero were longtime residents of Glastonbury. Through their charitable remainder trusts, the Norma and Natale Sestero Fund was established to support organizations that benefit people and institutions from the Town of Glastonbury in the areas of culture, health, education, social welfare and the environment (including town beautification and preservation of heritage).

## **Types of Support and Grant Focus:**

The Hartford Foundation supports a wide range of needs, including:

- 1. Capital/equipment projects (support for capital improvements, such as construction and renovation of a building or the purchase of capital equipment),
- 2. Capacity building (support for strengthening organizational capacity),
- 3. Enhance or strengthen existing activities (support to enhance, expand, or strengthen the range, quantity, and/or quality of an agency's programs and services. However, in general these funds **are not meant** to maintain the current activities or level of service),
- 4. General Operating Support (support of board approved strategic plan and/or annual plan), and
- 5. New activities or services (support for new programs or demonstration projects that do not commit the Foundation to recurring expenditures).

Proposals will be considered for the specific areas noted above. Requests for grants that will leverage other support (e.g., challenge grants) or employ a collaborative approach are encouraged. Requests for start-up support will not be considered through the Sestero Fund.

## **Funding Amounts and Duration:**

The maximum grant award is **\$60,000** for a **12-month period**. Note that the Foundation does not generally fund an entire project budget; therefore, additional funding sources must be identified or committed at the time of submission. Requests for projects that are finite in

duration, or will become self-sustaining over time, are encouraged. This fund is not intended to replace governmental funding of projects or needs that properly should be funded through the municipal appropriations process.

## **Proposal Process:**

Applications and all supporting materials are due to the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving no later than 11:59 pm on September 13, 2022. We anticipate that grant decisions will be made by mid-October, and all applicants will be notified.
