**Hartford Foundation for Public Giving
Request for Proposals
January 23, 2023**

The Hartford Foundation for Public Giving is pleased to announce that we are accepting applications for grants from the Pomeroy-Brace Fund. We project that grants ranging from **\$1,000 to \$28,000** will be awarded, depending upon the size and maturation of the agency and the scope of work to be performed through the proposed project.

Applicants are requested to complete the [online grant application](#) by end of day Monday, March 6, 2023. Grants will be announced in late April 2023.

Purpose of the Fund

Seth Pomeroy Holcombe and Lucy Eaton Holcombe lived in North Granby for over 30 years. Both were active in their community, enthusiastically supporting the culture and history of the town they loved. To continue their life of giving back, they established a fund that to support organizations that benefit people and institutions from the Town of Granby.

Types of Support and Grant Focus:

Grants awarded through this RFP may support a wide range of needs for organizations serving the residents of Granby, including:

1. Capital/equipment projects (support for capital improvements, such as construction and renovation of a building or the purchase of capital equipment),
2. Capacity building (support for strengthening organizational capacity),
3. Enhance or strengthen existing activities (support to enhance, expand, or strengthen the range, quantity, and/or quality of an agency's programs and services. However, in general these funds **are not meant** to maintain the current activities or level of service),
4. General Operating Support (support of board approved strategic plan and/or annual plan), and
5. New activities or services (support for new programs or demonstration projects that do not commit the Foundation to recurring expenditures).

Proposals will be considered for the specific areas noted above. Requests for grants that will leverage other support (e.g., challenge grants) or employ a collaborative approach are encouraged. Requests for start-up support or scholarships will not be considered through the Pomeroy-Brace Fund. Applicants must meet the Hartford Foundation basic grantee criteria, found halfway down this webpage [here](#). Non-501c3 community-based groups may apply using a fiscal sponsor.

Funding Amounts and Duration:

The maximum grant award is **up to \$28,000** for a 12-month period. Requests for projects that are finite in duration or will become self-sustaining over time are encouraged. **This fund is not intended to replace governmental funding of projects or needs that properly should be funded through the municipal appropriations process.**

Applicants should complete all required questions of the online application by the deadline in order to be deemed eligible for funding consideration. Each organization is invited to submit one proposal. The deadline for proposals is 11:59pm on Monday, March 6, 2023.
