Request for Proposals November 3, 2025

The Hartford Foundation for Public Giving is pleased to announce a competitive grant opportunity designed to provide summer campership, enrichment opportunities, and Counselor-in-Training programming[1] to Hartford youth and/or people of all ages with disabilities in our 29-town region. The Hartford Foundation welcomes requests of up to \$50,000 for activities implemented during the summer of 2026 and expects to award up to \$750,000 in total across all grantees.

UPDATE: The 2026 Summer Program application process has changed to invitation only. Organizations that received a Summer Program grant in any of the 2023-2025 summer seasons will be automatically invited to apply for a grant through the 2026 Summer Program Request for Proposals. This invitation does <u>NOT</u> guarantee that applicants will receive funding, nor that their full funding request will be met.

New or previously denied applicants interested in applying will need to schedule an eligibility interview with Foundation staff by Friday, December 19th to determine the summer program's eligibility and alignment to the goals of the Summer Program grant opportunity. Please refer to the <u>summer rubric</u> as well as the <u>interview questions</u> to help prepare for the conversation and self-assess the program's likelihood of alignment. Given funding limitations and a high demand for summer program grants, Foundation staff anticipate that only a small number of additional organizations will be invited to apply.

Applicants are requested to complete the <u>online grant application</u> by end of day, **Tuesday**, **January 13**, **2026**. Grants will be announced in **April 2026**.

I. Background:

The Hartford Foundation's goals in supporting summer programming are to 1) provide children in Hartford, as well as people of all ages with disabilities across the region, with a place to go during the traditional workday in support of working families while school is out of session, and 2) provide Hartford youth with career exposure through counselor-in-training (CIT) programs.

II. Proposal Requirements:

Grants will be considered for summer programs that can contribute to one or both Hartford Foundation's goals as outlined above. **Organizations currently receiving a core support grant through the Hartford Foundation are ineligible to apply.** If you are unsure whether you are a core support recipient, please reach out to your existing grant community impact officer to



confirm prior to submitting an application. Applicants should demonstrate cultural humility. Preference will be given to organizations that are Black or Latine led.

- **Population of Focus:** Programming <u>must</u> serve either Hartford youth or people of all ages with disabilities in the Foundation's <u>29-town region</u>.
- Eligible Applicants: Applicants must meet the Hartford Foundation basic grantee criteria, found halfway down this webpage here. Non-501c3 community-based groups may apply using a fiscal sponsor. Applicants must also have at least one summer experience running a summer program or the equivalent of at least one year's experience working with children in Hartford or with people (of any age) with a disability. All 2025 Summer grantees must complete the final report to be eligible for the 2026 Summer RFP.
- <u>Eligible Types of Programs:</u> Eligible types of programs include summer camperships, enrichment opportunities (programs that host campers form other agencies rather than hosting their own campers), tutorial experiences, or counselor-in-training (CIT) programs. ¹
- Programs should be hosted during the **traditional workday to support working families** and should **provide transportation where appropriate** (e.g., when the program site is not located in the community to be served).

Expected Measurement of Outcomes:

Funded proposals will be asked to track and report on the following measurements: 1) the number participating in overall programming, 2) the number of Hartford children participating in programming, 3) if applicable, the number of individuals with disabilities participating in programming, 4) the number of Hartford participants from low-income families, if/as identified during intake process to determine reduced-fee or free enrollment, and 5) if applicable, the number of CITs with a summary of activities geared toward career exposure.

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[•] Camperships: Provide reduced-fee or free summer programming, or cover related costs such as transportation and meals, enabling children, youth, and individuals with disabilities to attend day or overnight summer camps.

[•] Enrichment Programs: Offer additional learning opportunities to multiple summer programs funded by the Foundation. These programs do not provide camperships themselves and may include activities such as museum or library visits.

[•] Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Programs: Structured experiences for older youth (typically ages 14–18) that include leadership development, mentoring, hands-on training, and career exploration. These programs often include stipends and are supervised by program staff or field experts.

Applicants should complete all required questions of the online application by the deadline in order to be deemed eligible for funding consideration. Each organization is invited to submit one proposal. The deadline for proposals is 11:59pm on Tuesday, January 6, 2026.
