





Hartford Foundation 2023 Grantmaking Tops \$50 Million

The Hartford Foundation for Public Giving, the community foundation for 29 towns in Greater Hartford, **awarded \$50 million in grants to local nonprofits in 2023**. Since its founding in 1925, the Foundation has awarded more than \$998 million in grants.

Our grantmaking aligns with our commitment to dismantling structural racism and advancing equity, and our strategic outcomes.

Notable 2023 grants include:

- **\$4 million** total to Our Piece of the Pie, COMPASS Youth Collaborative and Roca Inc. to support their work with **opportunity youth** who are disconnected from school or jobs
- \$1.4 million total to The Open Hearth, Forge City Works, Girls For Technology and Makerspace CT as they create workforce opportunities for Black and Latine residents
- \$600,000 to help first-time homeowners through the Housing Development Fund*
- **\$965,000** to support the **offices of family and school partnerships** in East Hartford, Manchester, Vernon and Windsor
- \$600,000 to Hispanic Health Council to address health disparities for Latinos and other vulnerable communities
- \$574,000 to 65 nonprofits that provide basic human needs to Greater Hartford residents*
- \$224,000 in Love Your Block grants for neighborhood beautification projects in

- Hartford
- \$600,000 to the Greater Hartford Arts Council to support Black- and Latine-led arts organizations and artists

In 2019, we established 29 Greater Together Community Funds, one for each of the towns in our region. Last year, those community funds made **179** grants totaling \$700,000.

We couldn't do this work without the generosity of our donors. In 2023, the Foundation received gifts totaling nearly \$22.5 million. Local individuals, families and organizations opened a total of 26 new funds.


Hartford Foundation Awards \$300,000 Interfaith Security Grant

The Hartford Foundation announced a \$300,000 grant in support of an interfaith security initiative for organizations throughout Greater Hartford. The grant, awarded to **Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford**, will allow the local Jewish community to provide security assessment and training to an array of faith-based institutions across the region.

The grant builds on state and federal funding designed to combat hate crimes throughout Connecticut. It is designed to foster dialogue and collaboration between Greater Hartford's many faith communities.

"We must do all we can to ensure that the rise of hate speech and acts of religious discrimination and harassment do not threaten people's ability to safely attend their houses of worship," said Hartford Foundation President and CEO Jay Williams.

'Love Your Block' Returns for 2024

Love Your Block is a collaboration between the City of Hartford and the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving. This mini-grant program supports organizations or residents who want to make a difference in their community by funding projects focused on combating litter, activating vacant lots, and strengthening neighborhood pride. Social Enterprise Accelerator Participants Seek Matching Donations for Earned Income Ventures

Nonprofits across Greater Hartford are facing increased demand for their services, while raising funds becomes increasingly difficult.

In 2019, the Hartford Foundation created our **Social Enterprise Accelerator** (SEA) program, which helps nonprofits develop new products or services that align with their missions and support their financial sustainability. Sixteen organizations have already completed the SEA program and created millions in new revenue.

Last year, we welcomed the latest group of eight SEA participants. These nonprofits created business plans and pitched their ventures to potential donors in January. Now, **the Foundation is offering matching grants of up to \$30,000** to each organization to support their new earned income ventures.
