1,200 Young People Gain Work Experience Through 2025 Summer Youth Employment and Learning Program

The 2025 Summer Youth Employment and Learning Program (SYELP) — an initiative led by Capital Workforce Partners along with many public and private sector partners — is providing summer work experience to 1,200 young people, including 800 in Hartford.

For years, the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving has worked to increase Employment Opportunities for Greater Hartford residents. As a long-time funder of SYELP, we continue to take an evolving approach to how we support this program. This year, we awarded a \$400,000 grant to expand SYELP in Hartford. Our grant will create high-quality,

paid work-based learning for Hartford youth, that also connects to mental health services for students who need them. There is a focus on serving Opportunity Youth; young people ages 16-24 who are not in school or working. SYELP includes an integration with the Hartford Public Schools credit recovery program to help young people get reconnected with their education.

SYELP offers opportunities in fields like retail, education, and healthcare. Participants gain real-world work experience, resume building, professional development, and often, their first paid job.

Other partners in this program include the State of Connecticut and City of Hartford.

"The Summer Youth Employment and Learning Program is more than just a way to keep youth busy during the summer; it's an investment in the future of Hartford," said Mayor Arunan Arulampalam. "By providing our young people with hands-on experience and critical career readiness skills, we are building a talent pipeline right here in our city."

MakerspaceCT Summer Program Gives Students Knowledge For Life

Kimaylia has attended summer camp at **MakerspaceCT** for the past three years. In her first summer, she built working prosthetics that were donated. Last year, she returned as a paid intern, helping other students finish their projects.

This year, she conceived, designed, and built a Bluetooth speaker lamp from scratch using a 3D printer she gets to keep, thanks to a grant from the Foundation supporting Summer Camps.

Educator Julie Gauthier has watched Kimaylia grow each year and is excited for what's ahead. "I love watching students realize they can solve problems using the knowledge they're developing — that they can build anything they want, share it with friends, and even create their own communities around it."

Kimaylia laughs. "I like challenges, and I like failing — just to know I can learn from it. They made a whole box of my failed designs before I got my lamp. Before this camp, I made things — crochet and jewelry. Now, in five years, I see myself in medicine or engineering."

Social Enterprise Accelerator Participants Raise Money For New Ventures

The Hartford Foundation's Social Enterprise Accelerator (SEA) program was launched in 2018 to help nonprofits create new revenue-generating ventures. To date, nonprofits participating in SEA have raised \$13 million. The latest cohort of SEA participants began the process last October and announced their ventures earlier this year. Foundation awarded the first-ever series
of grants from the **Equality Fund**, a fund
created to support the wellbeing of

Previously, the Equality Fund commissioned DataHaven's LGBTQIA+ Resident Wellbeing study to illustrate the LGBTQIA+ community's quality of life in Greater Hartford.

100 Influencers of Greater Hartford: Anthony Byers

Anthony Byers has dedicated his career to unlocking opportunity through education. As Executive Director of Hartford Youth Scholars (HYS), he leads a program that supports over 250 Hartford students, achieving a 99% high school graduation rate and an 88% college completion rate within six years, far outpacing the national average for first-generation college students.

As part of our goal of increasing employment opportunities for residents of Greater Hartford, the Hartford Foundation has made several grants to support the work of Hartford Youth Scholars, including a \$250,000 two-year grant in 2023 and several Nonprofit Support Program grants over the past three years to support the organization's growth and resilience. The organization's record of success shows that they help students persist in their education and eventually have a better chance at gaining well-paid, meaningful employment.

"I believe education is the great equalizer," Byers says. "When we create systems that support students all the way through college and beyond, we change lives, we change families, and we change communities."
