
# The First Class of Greater Futures Scholars Heads Off to College

In April, the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving and Hartford Promise announced a milestone initiative meant to support Hartford students and combat the rising cost of college: The Greater Futures Scholarship Fund.

With a \$20 million initial investment from the Foundation, and support from some very generous donors, this first-of-its-kind program will offer scholarships of up to \$100,000 to every Hartford Promise student.

This month, the first class of Greater Futures Scholars — more than 100 students — heads off to college. Within three years, when the

program includes four classes of Scholars, we expect to support 500 students. We believe this will have a transformational effect on Greater Hartford as students graduate, return home, and begin productive careers without the constraints of student debt. For now, we wish the initial Greater Futures Scholars best of luck as they begin college. We look forward to seeing how you progress, and we know you'll make us proud!

Joanel was raised by three women, his mother and two older sisters. He shares, "I work hard to be a better version of myself every day." When Angelin Gomez Velez first heard the news about the Greater Futures Scholarship, she didn't believe it. "It really did throw that burden off of me... having to worry about the money," she said. As the oldest child and first to go to college, she carries the invisible load of being the one to break new ground. Her younger siblings study her every move, their futures shaped by what she shows is possible.

She is heading to UConn as an education major, her sights set on one day standing at the front of a high school English class. She knows being the example isn't easy. There are no road map, no parental playbook, but she's committed. "I really do want to be their role model."

For her, the scholarship is proof that long nights at the desk and deadlines met in the quiet hours can light the path for her family. It's the first step toward her own classroom, and toward a future where her siblings' road may be a little smoother.

More Than \$400,000 in Grants Awarded to Support Basic Human Needs

The Hartford Foundation has awarded Basic Human Needs Emergency Assistance Grants to 36 nonprofits, totaling more than \$400,000. In an effort to achieve equity, these grants prioritize nonprofits serving neighborhoods with a higher percentage of residents living in poverty. With the rising cost of groceries, most of this year's grants were foodrelated; however, they also include clothing, personal care items, and emergency financial aid assistance. ## Improving Our Grants Process, Using Feedback From Nonprofits


