

Wethersfield Greater Together Community Fund Prioritization Survey Outcomes



Thank you!

Thank you to everyone who took the time to take our survey! We were fortunate enough to receive 340 responses, 89% of whom (303) were Wethersfield residents, making our response rate 1.16% of total residents. We are pleased to have reached a more than 1% response rate, which leaves us confident that we have learned enough from our respondents to adequately understand the needs of the town as defined by those who live and work here.

However, we must also acknowledge our shortcomings, as this is still a small sample size and we do not want to assume that those who didn't respond, would respond the same as those who did. As you can see in the graphs shared on our website with this report, those who responded to the survey had a higher level of education than the general Wethersfield population, men were underrepresented, and we did not proportionally reach those under the age of 30. As a result, we must consider that there

are topics that are important to residents which our survey did not capture.

In each question, respondents were asked to select what they believed to be the top three areas of need in Wethersfield. First, we asked respondents to select their top three priorities from eight broad categories: Income and Asset Building, Employment, Health, Housing, Education, Community Engagement, Support Services, and Quality of Life. Each of those categories were then broken down into specific topics, and respondents were asked to select the three in each category that they consider to be of greatest importance for Wethersfield. These topics and their broader categories were selected by our diverse group of committee members based on their own knowledge and experience, and through reviewing the issues commonly used by Community Action Agencies in their community needs surveys.

Survey Results Respondents were asked to review 8 community needs related to the Wethersfield community and select the 3 they considered to be the most important. The Advisory Committee will consider the most common choices made by survey respondents as we determine which grant applications will benefit the greatest number of Wethersfield residents, or address the greatest areas of need as defined by the community.



1. 65.20% - Increasing after school activities for academic enrichment, STEM, homework assistances, recreation, arts, etc.

2. 61.76% - Additional guidance and counseling staff to assist with student mental health and planning for post-secondary education, employment and career options

3. 41.69% – Increasing opportunities for early childhood education programs to develop school readiness skills

4.38.56% - Increasing affordable childcare options for parents attending school/ training programs


5. 30.41% - Increasing the community's knowledge of available education resources and opportunities

6.24.76% - Greater participation of parents/caregiver in students' education

7. 17.87% - Increasing certificate/degree programs offered locally




